





Pricing Guide

The prices featured in this brochure are intended as a guide only and were correct at the time the brochure was printed. They may change due to exchange rate fluctuations, availability, taxes or seasonal surcharges.

The advertised prices for Classic Group Tours, Deluxe Group Tours, Small Group Journeys and Short Stays are per person for the duration specified. The "From" price is based on the departure date advertised. Your travel agent will be able to provide prices for other departure dates. Mandatory tips are indicated on the Classic Group Tours and Deluxe Group Tours, and are payable direct to the National Escort on arrival in China in the local currency, as indicated on the listings.

Prices featured in accommodation listings are per person twin share for the period specified unless otherwise stated. The "From" price has been calculated using the lowest nightly rate available, i.e. lead-in room type in off-peak season including free night offers if applicable, even if that offer is only available for part of a season. A minimum stay is generally required. Where prices for more than a one night stay are featured, the prices refer to stays of consecutive nights. Ask your travel agent for the best price available, other room types or travel dates.



How to Get There

BY AIR From New Zealand you can fly to China with Air New Zealand, Singapore Airlines, Cathay Pacific, Qantas and China Southern. Your Travel Agent can advise you on the best airlines to get you there.

Getting Around

If domestic flights are included in the tours featured in this brochure, they are based on economy class travel. All road travel is in comfortable, air-conditioned vehicles. Depending on the location, the type and size of the boat used while cruising on the Yangtze River will vary (check your itinerary for details). Day train journeys are in second class soft seats. Chinese high-speed day trains are often referred to as bullet trains.

Visas & Passports

All travellers must carry a passport with at least six months validity beyond the end of their journey. All visitors require a visa which must be obtained before departing New Zealand. A multiple entry visa is required if you are intending to enter China from Hong Kong. Travellers must enter Tibet via China only and obtain a permit prior to travel. The Tibet Autonomous Region may be closed by the Chinese authorities at any given time without notice. Such closures may impact the ability to travel in or to Tibet. Travel advice is available from the New Zealand Government Ministry of Foreign Affairs and Trade at www.safetravel.govt.nz.

Currency

The currency in China and Tibet is known as the Renminbi (RMB). The standard unit is known as the yuan (CNY). Chinese currency is difficult to find outside of China, therefore USD or Australian currency is the best currency to take. It is not recommended to take New Zealand dollars. Notes should be in good condition or they may not be exchanged. Most credit cards are accepted in hotels and major restaurants.

Tipping

Tipping is customary in many cultures and is a firm and expected element in the tourism industry in Asia. Mandatory tips are required for Classic Group Tours and Deluxe Group Tours, as indicated on the listings. This tip is paid directly to the National Escort on arrival in China. For all other products featured in this brochure, tipping is at your discretion.

Language

The official language in China is Mandarin. There are also numerous dialects spoken throughout different parts of China, including Cantonese.

Electricity

220V 50Hz. Electric plugs come in at least four sizes throughout China. Two flat pin plug is common in most parts of the country. An adapter is required.

Weather Guide

Due to its size, China's weather conditions vary. From May to October, spring and autumn offer a pleasant climate. May to August in the centre and north can be hot and humid. Potential snowfall can occur in the north from December to March. April to September is generally hot, wet and humid in the south.

Golden Week

China has three Golden Weeks in January/ February, April/May and October. Locals tend to travel to other parts of the country for their holidays. During these times, attractions are at least three times busier than at other peak times, hotels are often booked out, and train and air tickets are in high demand. It is important for travellers to take these dates into consideration when planning to visit China, and have a full understanding of what to expect.



Top 10 Things To Do







1. Great Wall of China

Walk into history as you take your first step onto the Great Wall of China. This ancient wonder, stretching for thousands of kilometres from the Yellow Sea to the Gobi Desert, is a historical marvel offering magnificent views of the surrounding area. Venture to the less crowded Mutianyu section and be rewarded with dramatic vistas and restored watchtowers.

2. Yangtze River

Cruise along the meandering gorges of the Yangtze River as you marvel at dramatic landscapes, sheer cliff faces and magnificent scenery. Each cruise ship offers the opportunity to unpack just once, and experience the sights and sounds of this iconic waterway in style. Marvel at the enormous scale of the Three Gorges Dam Project which significantly increased the water levels within the area.

3. Giant Pandas

Nestled in China's Sichuan province is Chengdu, home of the Giant Pandas. Visit the Chengdu Research Base of Giant Panda Breeding and gain an insight into these amazing animals. Watch the young pandas playing and munching their way through piles of bamboo. You may even have the opportunity to see newborns in their incubators.

4. Cuisine

From Peking Duck and Sichuan hot pot to dumplings and handmade noodles, prepare your tastebuds to be taken on a journey as diverse as China itself. Enjoy delicious roast duck wrapped in delicate pancakes, fiery spices dance in your mouth with a traditional hot pot and dumplings of every variety will leave you spoilt for choice.





5. Shanghai

Futuristic skyscrapers meet colonial architecture in the captivating city of Shanghai. Known as the 'Pearl of the Orient', wander along the historic Bund riverfront, explore the old city and French concession, and find tranquillity at the Yu Garden.

6. Beijing

Home to towering new buildings and ancient hutongs, Beijing is a modern city with an ancient heart. Delve into Beijing's imperial past as you explore the incredible Forbidden City, marvel at the stunning Temple of Heaven and wander across the vast expanse of Tiananmen Square.

7. Tibet

Sitting on the roof top of the world, Lhasa is Tibet's spiritual capital overflowing with natural beauty and architectural grandeur. From snow-capped mountains and turquoise lakes to a spiritual culture of welcoming people, Tibet has long captured the imaginations of travellers. (see page 24 and 42 for details)

8. Army of Terracotta Warriors

Xian is home to the Army of Terracotta Warriors. Considered one of the most important archaeological finds of the last century, the life-sized statues were unearthed in 1974. Take time to spot the differences between each of the 8,000 intricately-carved unique statues.


9. Guilin, Longsheng & Yangshuo

Venture to Guilin and discover towering limestone mountains and tea plantations. Longsheng is home to spectacular rice terraces known as the Dragon's Backbone. Cruise along the Li River and marvel at the stunning limestone karst scenery and traditional rural scenes as you arrive into charming Yangshuo.

10. The Silk Road

Zhujiajiao & Mt Huang (Yellow Mountain)

Venture from Shanghai to immerse yourself in the charming old world atmosphere of Zhujiajiao, a traditional water canal town. A network of waterways meander past old wooden houses, narrow laneways, and under stone arch bridges. A peaceful canal cruise is the perfect way to absorb the atmosphere of this century-old Chinese town. Discover the jagged peaks and natural beauty of World Heritage Listed Mt Huang (Yellow Mountain). Chengdu

Nestled in the picturesque Sichuan province, Chengdu is best known for the Chengdu Research Base of Giant Panda Breeding. The centre is considered to be one of the best places to see Giant Pandas in an environment closely resembling their natural habitat. Although rapidly developing, Chengdu has wonderful examples of backstreet life, teahouses and parks. Relax in a traditional teahouse with a traditional brew of tea, sample the spicy Sichuan cuisine or see a Sichuan Opera performance which is more like a cabaret than traditional opera.



Leshan

Leshan is home to the world's largest stone-carved Buddha which sits at the confluence of the Min, Dadu and Qingyi Rivers. Standing at 71 metres, the Buddha was built in AD713 under the instruction of a Buddhist monk, Haitong. Cruise along the river and be rewarded with the best views of the Buddha or climb to the bottom of the Buddha's feet and gain an appreciation of the statue's enormous size.



Yangtze River

As the longest river in China and the third largest river in the world, the Yangtze flows approximately 6,300 kilometres from the snow-capped mountain of Tanggula Shan in the Qinghai Tibet Plateau to the East China Sea in Shanghai. Cruise along the Yangtze River and experience an unforgettable journey through the magnificent and dramatic landscape of the Three Gorges. See the enormity of the Three Gorges Dam Project which raised the water level 70 to 100 metres.



Chongqing & Dazu

As one of the gateways to the Yangtze River, Chongqing is the perfect place to begin your cruise and marvel at the Dazu cliff carvings. Discover the statues and carvings of the Dazu Caves which date from the 9th to 13th century with Buddhist, Taoist and Confucian influences. In Chongqing, explore Ciqikou ancient town which offers a glimpse into the area's heritage. Take the opportunity to try a local hot pot – a communal dining experience where a simmering pot of stock is placed on the table and you cook thinly sliced meat, vegetables and tofu.



Guilin, Yangshuo & Li River

The Guangxi Province is considered to be one of China's most picturesque regions. Guilin is famous for its stunning natural scenery. Breathtaking landscapes, limestone karst, vibrant rice paddies and crystal clear waters have inspired poets and artists for centuries. Guilin is the ideal place to view the famous Longji rice terraces at Longsheng before cruising along the stunning Li River to the picturesque town of Yangshuo. Spend time wandering the cobbled streets of this charming town.



Guanazhou

Set along the Pearl River, Guangzhou is an energetic port city with a wealth of lively restaurants, shops and bars. Guangzhou is China's third largest city and is known for its incredible shopping opportunities with goods available for sale at a fraction of the prices paid by travellers in their home countries. Located close to Hong Kong and Macau, the city has the highest number of restaurants per capita in China and offers a varied and authentic range of Cantonese dishes.




The Silk Road

Tibet








Guilin

Days 1-2: Xian

Days 1-3: Beijing
